Summary and Overall Rating

Biscayne Gardens Elementary is a public Title I school in Biscayne Gardens, Miami, serving PreK through grade 5. The school offers a Gifted and Talented program and standard academic and support services. Test scores fall below average, and parent reviews are mixed. The school operates under Miami Dade County Public Schools, which enforces gender identity affirmation and LGBTQ inclusive policies from the earliest grades.

From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **3.5 out of 10** rating in alignment with conservative educational values. The campus environment is stable but shaped by district-wide mandates on identity and inclusion.

1. General Overview

The school serves around 377 to 700 students depending on sources and employs about 30 to 47 teachers. This results in a student-to-teacher ratio between 13 to 17 to 1. It offers preschool, Gifted and Talented, English for Speakers of Other Languages, special education, and standard extracurricular activities. The campus includes a library, cafeteria, and common areas.

2. Academic Standing

The school receives mixed ratings. GreatSchools averages around 3 out of 5 stars and Niche gives a B-minus. State proficiency rates are about 48 percent in math and 42 percent in reading. Test results are below statewide averages. Parent complaints cite limited enrichment activities and inconsistent quality among teachers.

3. Student Demographics

The school is located in the Biscayne Gardens neighborhood, which has a population of roughly 32,500 with about 68 percent Black and 22 percent Hispanic residents. The student population reflects similar diversity and significant economic need.

4. Facilities and Programs

The campus includes a main building, a library, cafeteria, special area classrooms, and space for extracurricular activities. Standard programming includes Gifted and Talented, after-school clubs, media support, and sports. Parent involvement appears limited, with a reportedly inactive PTA.

5. Values and Cultural Environment

District Policies on Gender Identity and LGBTQ Inclusion

Miami-Dade County Public Schools includes gender identity and sexual orientation under anti-discrimination and anti-bullying policies. Staff must respect students' chosen names and pronouns from the earliest grades. The district SAFE Network encourages LGBTQ-affirming environments in all schools. Parents with traditional values may find these policies age-inappropriate or misaligned with their family beliefs.

School-Level Practice

There are no known controversies involving LGBTQ issues at the school. Administrators and staff follow district policies fully, including mandatory training. While there is no active promotion, identity-affirming practices may still be present. Parents concerned about these policies are encouraged to meet with school leadership.

6. School Board and Political Climate

In 2022, the Miami Dade School Board voted against recognizing LGBTQ History Month in high schools and opposed adding LGBTQ civil rights content to senior classes. Elementary schools like this one remain subject to district inclusion mandates. This reflects tension between conservative state-level directives and local progressive policies.

7. Parent Concerns

Traditional families may raise these concerns:

- Early exposure to gender identity topics in young children
- Privacy policies that may limit parental notification about identity preferences
- Academic focus being shifted toward social identity themes

While the school lacks activism, its compliance with district-mandated inclusion policies may conflict with some family values.

8. Conclusion

Biscayne Gardens Elementary provides standard academic instruction, a Gifted and Talented program, and basic extracurriculars. The student body reflects neighborhood diversity and socioeconomic need. Parent feedback is mixed, with concerns about school engagement and educational quality.

Families who prioritize traditional values should note that the school is governed by district policies promoting early gender identity and LGBTQ inclusion. While the school environment is stable, its policy framework reflects broader progressive mandates.

Parents may wish to engage with the school administration, inquire into policy practices, and consider whether the school aligns with their values.

Final Summary for Parents

Biscayne Gardens Elementary offers basic academic services and Gifted programming, though performance is average. It operates under district policies affirming early LGBTQ inclusion, which may concern traditional families. Parents are encouraged to meet with the school, review policy implementation, and assess whether this educational framework fits their family values before enrolling.
