Community Report on Broadmoor Elementary School A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

Summary and Overall Rating

Broadmoor Elementary School is a Title I public school in northwest Miami-Dade, serving students from PreK through grade 5. The school offers a supportive learning environment with safety training such as WalkSafe programs and campus renovation efforts. However, it is governed by Miami-Dade County Public Schools, which enforces gender identity affirmation and LGBTQ inclusive policies from the earliest grades.

From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **3.5 out of 10** rating for alignment with conservative educational values. The school provides a calm and structured atmosphere, but district-wide identity policies significantly shape its environment.

1. General Overview

The school supports approximately 450–500 students (varied data) with a student-to-teacher ratio near 16 to 1. It features standard classrooms, a library, and outdoor areas. It conducts safety programs such as partnership with University of Miami's WalkSafe during Walk to School Day and uses regular campus renovations to improve learning spaces.

2. Academic Standing

Broadmoor holds an overall "A" rating, with high proficiency scores significantly above district and state averages. Safety education and infrastructure improvements are notable features. The

school does not currently appear among top performers academically, but progress is steady and upward.

3. Student Demographics

The student body is diverse, representing Hispanic, Black, and other backgrounds. A significant portion of students qualify for free or reduced-price lunch, reflecting a working-class demographic with district Title I resources in place.

4. Facilities and Programs

Facilities include classroom spaces, a media center, and outdoor learning areas. Recent investments include a multi-million-dollar campus renovation. The school participates in safety initiatives like WalkSafe and organizes extracurricular and enrichment activities typical of Title I schools.

5. Values and Cultural Environment

District Policies on Gender Identity and LGBTQ Inclusion

Miami-Dade County Public Schools enforces protective measures for gender identity and sexual orientation, expecting staff to affirm chosen names and pronouns. SAFE Network training promotes LGBTQ affirming environments beginning in early grades. Traditional families may find the early emphasis on identity and pronouns inappropriate or misaligned with their beliefs.

School-Level Practice

Broadmoor Elementary has not been publicly embroiled in controversies related to LGBTQ matters. It fully complies with district mandates, including staff training and identity affirmation protocols. Parents concerned about policy applications at the classroom level may wish to consult school administrators.

6. Recent Negative Incidents or Controversies

Two negative incidents have been associated with the school or its surroundings:

- A. A tragic bike accident involving a teen near Broadmoor Elementary prompted safety measures and a WalkSafe event. No charges were filed against the driver. The event highlighted school zone safety concerns.
- B. Online complaints surfaced alleging bullying by staff, with reports stating "They bully our children they're supposed to be helping and send them away without a phone call to the parents." While these appear as social media comments and are unverified, they reflect a level of parent dissatisfaction.

While these incidents are not deeply ingrained controversies, they are relevant concerns for safety and school-staff interactions.

7. School Board and Political Climate

In 2022, the Miami-Dade School Board moved against recognizing LGBTQ History Month and introducing LGBTQ civil rights content in high school. Elementary schools such as Broadmoor remain governed by district-wide LGBTQ inclusive policies. The contrasting approaches showcase tension between higher-level mandates and local political pressures.

8. Parent Concerns

Families who prefer traditional values may be concerned about:

- Early exposure to gender identity pronoun and name policies
- Privacy protocols possibly bypassing parental awareness
- Classroom priority shifting from academics to social identity affirmation
- School safety around traffic zones and staff-student interactions

While there are no high-profile controversies, these observations indicate areas that may concern conservative families.

9. Conclusion

Broadmoor Elementary provides a safe, structured learning environment with academic progress and community safety initiatives. Campus upgrades and pedestrian safety programs reflect a focus on student welfare.

However, budget constraints typical of Title I schools, district-level identity policies from PreK onward, traffic safety risks, and reported bullying concerns highlight areas that conservative families should evaluate carefully.

Final Summary for Parents

Broadmoor Elementary offers a positive learning environment with strong academic indicators and school safety programs. It is part of a district that enforces early identity inclusion and pronoun policies. Additionally the tragic traffic incident and allegations of staff bullying raise safety and oversight concerns.

Parents seeking traditional or family-values-based education should speak with administrators, explore policies and safety protocols, and determine whether Broadmoor aligns with their expectations before enrolling.
