



Community Report on Christina M. Eve Elementary School
A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Summary and Overall Rating

Christina M. Eve Elementary School is a high performing public school in West Kendall, Florida. It serves grades PreK through 5 and consistently ranks in the top tier of Florida public schools based on test performance and academic recognition. The school offers STEAM programs, gifted enrichment, and strong family engagement. However, it operates under a district that actively promotes LGBTQ inclusion and gender identity affirmation starting in early grades.

From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **3.5 out of 10** rating for alignment with conservative educational values. This score reflects a school that maintains academic excellence and a peaceful environment but follows a district with progressive policies on gender and inclusion.

1. General Overview

Opened in 2002, Christina M. Eve Elementary serves approximately 506 students with a student to teacher ratio of around 14 to 1. It is a Title I school located in a suburban neighborhood in West Kendall. The school is part of Miami Dade County Public Schools, one of the most progressive districts in Florida regarding equity and inclusion initiatives.

2. Academic Standing

The school has earned an A grade from the state of Florida and a perfect 10 rating on GreatSchools. State assessments show approximately 73 percent proficiency in math and 77 percent in reading. The school also received National Blue Ribbon recognition and offers a robust STEAM curriculum with a focus on science, technology, engineering, arts, and math.

3. Student Demographics

Roughly 92 percent of the student body is Hispanic, with smaller percentages of Black, multiracial, and White students. About 41 percent of students qualify for free or reduced lunch, making it a moderately diverse school in terms of economic background. The school is known for its community engagement and parent participation.

4. Facilities and Programs

Christina M. Eve Elementary features modern classrooms, a library and media center, a dedicated STEAM lab, and outdoor activity areas. Programs include Gifted and Talented, STEAM enrichment, music, and extracurriculars such as robotics and science clubs. Family involvement is encouraged through events, PTA, and parent volunteer opportunities.

5. Values and Cultural Environment

District Policies on Gender Identity and LGBTQ Inclusion

The school adheres to Miami Dade's district-wide inclusion policies that protect sexual orientation and gender identity. Teachers are expected to use students' preferred names and pronouns. The SAFE Network initiative supports training and resources to create affirming environments for LGBTQ students, even at the elementary level.

From a traditional perspective, this may conflict with family values or raise concerns about age-appropriate exposure. District policy does not require parental notification when a student uses different pronouns or names.

School Level Practice

There have been no public controversies involving LGBTQ issues at Christina M. Eve. The school appears to implement policies without emphasis or activism. However, teachers and staff are still required to follow district expectations, including inclusivity training and affirming language protocols.

6. Recent Negative Incidents or Controversies

There are no recorded incidents of controversy, misconduct, or public criticism related to identity issues, safety, or staff behavior. The school maintains a positive reputation within its community.

7. School Board and Political Context

In 2022, the Miami Dade School Board voted against recognizing LGBTQ History Month in high schools, reflecting tension between state-level parental rights laws and district inclusion goals. Despite that vote, district policy continues to support inclusive practices across all grades, including elementary schools.

8. Parent Concerns

Parents with traditional or religious values may express concern about:

- Early introduction of pronouns and gender identity topics
- Lack of automatic parental disclosure in identity-related matters
- School compliance with district ideology over core academic priorities
- Limited ability to opt out of exposure to certain social topics

These are not specific to Christina M. Eve Elementary but stem from broader district mandates.

9. Final Rating: 3.5 out of 10

Policy Environment: 2

The school follows district policies that promote gender and identity inclusion starting in early grades.

School-Level Practice: 5

While there is no activism or controversy, staff still follow inclusivity mandates and participate in related training.

Classroom Exposure: 4

There is no formal LGBTQ curriculum, but students may be exposed to pronoun use or inclusive discussions through staff practices and counseling.

Community and Cultural Tone: 6

The school maintains strong academics and a calm culture, but district ideology shapes policy expectations and staff behavior.

Final Summary for Parents

Christina M. Eve Elementary School is an academically strong, well-managed school that serves its community with pride. Its success in reading, math, and STEAM instruction makes it attractive to many families. However, traditional or faith-based parents should be aware that

the school follows district-wide policies that include early gender identity affirmation and staff expectations to use preferred pronouns.

If you are a parent who prioritizes conservative values or prefers to keep social and identity topics out of the classroom during early childhood, it is recommended to engage with the school administration, request clarity on daily practices, and consider whether the district's overall direction aligns with your family's priorities.
