Summary and Overall Rating

Comstock Elementary is a public Title I school located in the Allapattah neighborhood of Miami, serving PreK through 5th grade. With approximately 585 students and a student—teacher ratio of 18 to 1, the school offers standard programs including Gifted and Talented and basic extracurriculars. Its academic performance is below average compared to Florida schools, with reading proficiency around 28% and math around 32% on state tests.

From a traditional or faith-based viewpoint, Comstock Elementary receives a **3.5 out of 10** rating for alignment with conservative values. The school faces challenges in academic outcomes, community behavior, and communication, which may concern parents prioritizing structure and academic achievement.

1. General Overview

Comstock Elementary serves around 585 students across PreK to 5th grade with approximately 32 teachers, maintaining a student-teacher ratio of 18 to 1. It includes core education programs, Gifted and Talented offerings, and two sports options. The campus features typical facilities: classrooms, playgrounds, library, and participation in schoolwide activities such as a summer reading program and mental health support initiative.

2. Academic Standing

The school is rated 3 out of 10 on GreatSchools due to below-average test scores: reading proficiency at about 28% and math at 32%. US News reports similar figures, significantly lower than district averages, reflecting an academic environment in need of improvement.

3. Student Demographics

Students are predominantly Hispanic (about 90%) with around 9% Black and minimal White or Asian representation. Approximately 64% qualify for free or reduced-price lunch, indicating a high-need student population.

4. Facilities and Programs

The campus includes standard classrooms, outdoor play areas, media resources, and sports. The school offers a summer reading initiative, parent academy programs, mental health services, and volunteer opportunities. Gifted and Talented programs are in place, though academic support for struggling students may be limited.

5. Values and Cultural Environment

As part of Miami-Dade Public Schools, Comstock must follow district rules protecting sexual orientation and gender identity. Teachers are expected to respect student pronouns and participate in inclusive training. From a traditional viewpoint, these practices may conflict with family beliefs and may begin at an early age.

6. Recent Negative Incidents or Controversies

Parent reviews reveal concerns about behavior issues, poor communication, and staff responsiveness. Complaints include incidents of student fights without parental notification, disorganization in dismissal procedures, teacher disrespectfulness, and inconsistencies in coaching and administrative communication. These issues suggest gaps in discipline, communication, and overall school climate.

7. School Board and Political Context

In 2022 the Miami-Dade School Board voted against recognizing LGBTQ History Month in high schools and against including LGBTQ civil rights content in upper grades. However, elementary schools continue to operate under district policies supporting gender identity and inclusion.

8. Parent Concerns

Traditional or faith-based families may be troubled by:

- Continued underperformance in reading and math
- Reports of student fights and poor supervision

- Lack of communication from staff and inconsistent messaging
- Implementation of inclusive pronoun policies without parental notice
- Staff training and direction that may focus less on discipline and more on ideology

Final Summary for Parents

Comstock Elementary is a community-centered school with a diverse student body and basic academic and enrichment offerings. However, current test scores fall below district averages, and parent accounts highlight concerns over student behavior, communication breakdowns, and inconsistent disciplinary practices.

Families with traditional or faith-based values should consider:

- 1. Visiting the school to observe classroom environments and discipline procedures
- 2. Meeting with teachers and administrators to discuss academic support and communication standards
- 3. Inquiring about safety measures, supervision, and handling of student behavior
- 4. Considering alternative local schools if academic strength and parent-school partnership are top priorities
