



Community Report on Coral Terrace Elementary School

A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Summary and Overall Rating

Coral Terrace Elementary serves PreK through 5th grade in the Coral Terrace area of Miami. Academically, it ranks in the top 30% of Florida elementary schools, with proficiency rates around 65–69% in math and 60–64% in reading. It offers a Gifted & Talented program and shows significant improvement trends.

However, the school faces concerns related to absenteeism, below-district literacy scores in early grades, and parent complaints about staff and communication. The district mandates LGBTQ inclusion and pronoun policies from early grades without opt-out provisions.

From a traditional or faith-based vantage point, Coral Terrace Elementary earns a **3.5 out of 10**, reflecting strong academics but tempered by demographic needs, policy concerns, and community feedback.

1. Academic Standing & Student Body

- Serves about 475 students with a 16 to 1 student–teacher ratio.
- Ranked in the top 30% of Florida elementary schools based on test scores.
- Math proficiency around 67%; reading proficiency about 62%.

- Noted improvements over recent years, particularly in literacy and numeracy.

2. Programs & Support Services

The school offers Gifted & Talented classes and standard instructional tracks. Support services include:

- English Language Learner assistance
- Special education interventions
- Reading labs and academic booster sessions

While enrichment beyond the basics is limited, key supports help students stay on track.

3. Community & Facilities

The campus features typical classrooms, a library, and outdoor areas. The PTA hosts occasional parent events, though reviews suggest fewer opportunities for extensive parental engagement. A School Climate Survey is conducted annually, indicating openness to feedback.

4. Policy & Cultural Environment

District policy requires respect for student-chosen names and pronouns from early grades with no opt-out. While no formal LGBTQ programs appear on campus, inclusive language and identity support may occur in informal settings.

Traditional parents may want clarification on how such policies function in classrooms and whether family preferences are respected.

5. Recent Concerns & Incidents

Notable challenges reported by parents include:

- Rising chronic absenteeism (from low 20s to low 30s percent in recent years).
- Third-grade reading proficiency around 43%, below district and state averages.
- Parent reviews mention rude or disengaged teachers.
- Complaints about inconsistent communication and insufficient supervision, particularly during arrival and dismissal.

These issues suggest needs in academic support, staff engagement, and operations.

6. District Context & Board Climate

Although the Miami-Dade School Board blocked LGBTQ History Month and civil rights content in high school, elementary schools like Coral Terrace remain under inclusive mandates. Parents may wish to stay informed of policy updates and school-level implementation.

7. Parent Concerns & Recommended Actions

Parents with conservative or faith-based values may consider:

- How identity policies affect children in PreK–5 classrooms
- School's efforts to reduce absenteeism and improve early literacy
- Protocols for handling communications with parents
- Opportunities to engage via PTA, volunteers, or advisory committees

Helpful steps:

Request regular teacher check-ins, attend climate surveys, explore tutoring or early literacy programs, review attendance policies, and join parent groups for collective insight.

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Final Summary for Parents

Coral Terrace Elementary stands out academically with strong test results and signs of growth. Yet parents should consider rising absentee rates, literacy concerns in early grades, and operational issues like staff communication and supervision. Its adherence to district identity and inclusion policies may also be an area to discuss with school leadership.

Traditional or faith-based families seeking academic rigor aligned with their values may wish to:

1. Attend PTA meetings and meet with staff
2. Confirm early literacy strategies and communication plans
3. Explore tutoring and engagement options

4. Monitor implementation of district policies in the classroom
