# Community Report on Cutler Ridge Elementary School

## A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

### Summary and Overall Rating

Cutler Ridge Elementary is a public Title One school in Cutler Bay, serving students from PreK through grade Five. The school enrolled between four hundred and six hundred twenty-five students, maintaining a student-teacher ratio close to sixteen to one. It earns a B grade overall, with approximately fifty-seven percent proficiency in math and forty-seven percent in reading. The school offers Gifted and Talented classes, STEAM opportunities, and standard extracurriculars.

The school operates under district policies mandating gender identity and LGBTQ inclusion from the earliest grades without a parental opt-out. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of three point five out of ten**. Families may appreciate the strong academic structure and consistent behavior expectations but could have concerns about identity-related protocols and communication practices.

### 1. Academic Standing & Programs

The school performs above average, with:

- Fifty-seven percent of students proficient in math

- Forty-seven percent proficient in reading
- A B-grade academic rating
- Gifted and Talented offerings alongside STEAM instruction
- A summer reading initiative and mental health support programs

These features support both advanced learning and academic reinforcement.

## **2. Student Community & Support Services**

Cutler Ridge serves a diverse student body made up of approximately seventy-three percent Hispanic, twenty percent Black, and five percent White students. About sixty-eight percent qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. The school offers ESL and special education services as well as reading support through Title One funding.

Mental health resources and counseling are provided through district support.

## **3. Facilities & School Environment**

The campus includes classrooms, a library, media center, STEAM lab, playgrounds, and after-school care. A uniform policy reinforces discipline and equality. The school has an elected advisory council (EESAC) that meets monthly to involve parent and community voices.

## **4. Values & Cultural Environment**

District rules require teachers to respect student-chosen names and pronouns, with mandatory staff training on LGBTQ inclusion. While no formal identity-focused programs are visible, inclusive language may appear informally.

Helpful tip for parents

Review the school handbook and attend EESAC meetings early in the school year to understand how identity protocols are communicated and enforced.

## **5. Discipline & Behavior**

Uniforms, consistent rules, and a code of conduct guide student behavior. Infractions are handled through a range of responses, including conferences, parent notifications, and administrative action. Staff report that most issues are resolved collaboratively with families.

## **6. Parent Engagement & Communication**

Parents can stay involved through several channels:

- Monthly EESAC meetings
- Workshops offered by the Parent Academy
- Volunteer opportunities in classrooms and events

- Regular updates shared through the school website and social media platforms

Background checks are required for in-person volunteers and clear communication channels are encouraged between staff and families.

## **7. Recent Challenges & Improvements**

The school has not recently faced major controversies. Improvement plans are reviewed by administration, and leadership indicates efforts to maintain academic progress and community trust.

## **8. District Context & Policies**

While the Miami-Dade School Board has opted not to recognize LGBTQ History Month in high schools, elementary schools like Cutler Ridge remain subject to inclusive policies that shape staff training and daily practice.

## **9. Parent Concerns & Recommended Actions**

Parents with conservative or faith-based values may want to focus on:

- How pronoun and identity policies are applied in the classroom
- Academic progress in reading and math proficiency
- Enforcement of discipline and supervision routines
- Communication regarding homework, events, and any staff concerns

Helpful steps for families

1. Attend monthly EESAC meetings to raise questions and hear updates
2. Contact teachers at the start of the year to set communication preferences
3. Enroll in Parent Academy workshops to understand academic and support programs
4. Volunteer in the school to observe the learning environment firsthand
