



Community Report on Dr. Henry E. Perrine Academy of the Arts
A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Summary and Overall Rating

Dr Henry E Perrine Academy of the Arts serves students from PreK through fifth grade in Perrine. The school enrolls about six hundred twenty students with a ratio of sixteen students per teacher. Academic outcomes are strong with around seventy eight percent reading proficiency and eighty two percent math proficiency. The academy blends standard academics with enriched arts instruction.

The school follows district policies that require staff to honor student chosen names and pronouns from early grades with no option for parents to opt out. From a traditional or faith based viewpoint the school receives a **rating of three point five out of ten**. Its strong academics and creative offerings are strengths yet district identity protocols may concern some families.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

Perrine Academy performs well academically and integrates arts throughout the learning experience. Students participate in weekly visual arts music dance and theater lessons. Enrichment opportunities include robotics spelling bee student council and STEM challenges. The school maintains Gifted and Talented classes and supports differentiated instruction.

2. Student Community and Support Services

The school serves thirty to sixty percent free or reduced lunch families and is ethnically diverse. Support services include ESL specialized instruction at all levels reading coaches school counseling and character education. Tutors and coaches offer academic support to early learners through grade five.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

Facilities include classrooms dedicated to arts and science a media center and an outside learning courtyard. A small performance stage supports student showcases. Arrival and dismissal are supervised. After school clubs include youth orchestra robotics arts and community service. Family nights and community showcases reinforce parent involvement.

4. Values and Policy Environment

Miami Dade district policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are trained to support pronoun usage and inclusive environments. Inclusive language may appear in announcements or counseling sessions. The school does not focus on identity activism yet district policy influences daily practice.

Parents may wish to ask how these policies are applied in classrooms and whether teacher communication supports family values.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

No recent safety issues misconduct or controversies are reported. The academy conducts drills for emergencies and follows district protocols for climate and crisis response. Leadership communicates promptly about health or safety incidents when they arise.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents can engage through monthly advisory council and PTA meetings as well as Parent Academy events covering academic support arts activities and online safety. A school newsletter and app keep families informed of events calendars and announcements. Classroom volunteering and family reading nights are encouraged.

7. Parent Concerns and Recommended Actions

Families with traditional values may want to consider:

- How identity and pronoun policies are conveyed in early grades
- Academic pace and homework expectations
- Communication protocols for behavioral or safety concerns
- How families can influence policy decisions via advisory council or volunteering

Helpful steps for parents:

- 1 Schedule meetings with teachers to discuss expectations and values
 - 2 Attend arts showcases and literacy nights to assess student experience
 - 3 Join advisory council or volunteer opportunities to observe school culture
 - 4 Review the student handbook to understand all identity protocols

Engaging with leadership reviewing school guidelines and observing classroom culture can help determine if the school aligns with family values.
