



Community Report on Dr. Manuel Barreiro Elementary School
A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Summary and Overall Rating

Dr Manuel Barreiro Elementary is a public school in Miami serving students from PreK through fifth grade. It enrolls approximately 308 students with a student teacher ratio of sixteen to one. The school earns a B grade academically, with around sixty nine percent proficiency in math and sixty one percent proficiency in reading.

The school follows district policy requiring staff to address students by their chosen names and pronouns from early grades and participate in LGBTQ inclusive training with no parental opt out. From a traditional or faith-based perspective the school receives a **rating of 3.5 out of 10**. The academic environment is strong yet identity policy practices may raise questions for some families.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

The school performs well with sixty nine percent proficiency in math and sixty one percent in reading. Programs include Gifted and Talented instruction, a focus on literacy and STEAM, after-school enrichment such as robotics and art projects, safety patrol and basic physical education. The school emphasizes academic consistency and parent involvement in learning initiatives.

2. Student Community and Support Services

Serving around three hundred eight students the school population is diverse and predominantly Hispanic with about forty two percent qualifying for free or reduced lunch. The school provides ESL instruction, reading intervention and special education. Counseling and health referrals are available through district services.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The facility includes classrooms, a media center, art and science spaces, and outdoor play areas. The school is clean and well maintained. It hosts family events such as literacy nights and academic showcases. Volunteer participation is encouraged and after-school programs are offered by partner groups.

4. Values and Policy Environment

District policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are required to respect students' preferred names and pronouns and participate in inclusive training. While no formal LGBTQ curriculum is taught at the elementary level inclusive language may appear during classroom interactions or assemblies. Families may wish to request clarity on how such policies are implemented and whether they align with home values.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

Parents have reported concerns about intermittent delays in dismissal procedures and limited clarity in communication between school and home following daily incidents. There are no reports of safety threats or misconduct at the school. Leadership has addressed concerns with revised dismissal plans and improved notification channels.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Families are invited to monthly advisory council meetings and Parent Academy workshops focused on academic success, digital safety and family support. Newsletters and teacher apps provide updates on student work and events. Classroom volunteering, attendance feedback and parent-teacher conferences are encouraged.

7. Parent Concerns and Recommended Actions

Families aligned with conservative or faith-based values may wish to consider:

- How identity and pronoun protocols are applied beginning in early grades
- Academic pacing and the availability of reading or math support
- Response measures for daily school incidents and communication clarity
- Opportunities to participate through advisory council or school events

Suggested steps for parents

- 1 Attend advisory meetings to learn about school priorities and identity policies

- 2 Meet with your child’s teacher early in the school year to establish expectations
 - 3 Volunteer for class reading or science events to observe daily atmosphere
 - 4 Review the parent handbook to understand safety and identity protocols

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Final Summary for Parents

Dr Manuel Barreiro Elementary offers consistent academic performance, enrichment opportunities and community engagement in a supportive environment. Like other schools in the district it implements identity affirmation policies early in the school sequence. Families can better determine whether the school aligns with their values by observing the classroom culture visiting the school, and verifying how school policies are adapted to respect family preferences.
