Summary and Overall Rating

Dr Robert B Ingram Elementary serves students from PreK through fifth grade in Coconut Grove, Miami, with approximately 480 students and a student-teacher ratio around 17 to 1. The school offers steady academic performance with approximately 67 percent proficiency in math and 62 percent in reading. It consistently receives a B grade on performance reviews at the state level.

The school follows district policy that requires staff to honor student-chosen names and pronouns from early grades, with no opt-out option provided for parents. From a traditional or faith-based standpoint this school receives a **rating of 3.5 out of 10**. Families may value its solid academics and inclusive learning environment, but district identity policies and limited community feedback may warrant closer review.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

The school's academic strengths include:

- Approximately 67 percent of students proficient in math
- Around 62 percent reading proficiency

- Gifted and Talented offerings and STEAM enrichment programs
- After-school clubs such as art choir robotics and reading groups
- Special events like family science fairs and literacy nights

These offerings support both academic growth and enrichment.

2. Student Community and Support Services

With approximately 480 students, the school is ethnically diverse, drawing families from across Coconut Grove and surrounding neighborhoods. Roughly 30 percent of students qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. Services include ESL support, special education, reading intervention, guidance counseling, and academic coaching. Volunteers and family involvement help support school events and classroom activities.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes standard classrooms, a media center, STEAM and art spaces, and shaded outdoor learning areas. School leadership enforces safety protocols for arrival dismissal and internal movement. After-school programs are available through community partnerships and parent-led initiatives. Events like art showcases and book fairs help bring families together.

4. Values and Policy Environment

District policy mandates respect for student-preferred names and pronouns. Staff complete LGBTQ-inclusive training as part of district requirements. The school does not advertise identity programs but inclusive language may appear during counseling or announcements.

Parents may wish to ask how personal family preferences are honored and how these policies affect classroom interactions.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

No recent safety or misconduct incidents have been reported. However parents have noted occasional delays in communication following student behavior events. Leadership has responded by refining reporting protocols and adjusting communication with families to ensure transparency.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Ingram Elementary encourages parent involvement through:

- Monthly advisory council and PTO meetings
- Parent Academy sessions on academic support and school safety
- Opportunities to volunteer in classrooms and at events

Regular newsletters, social media updates and school website announcements

Families are encouraged to connect early and attend meetings to observe school culture in action.

7. Parent Concerns and Recommended Actions

Traditional or faith-based families may wish to consider:

- How identity and pronoun policies are applied in early grade classrooms
- Availability of academic support or tutoring if students fall behind
- School procedures to inform parents shortly after incidents involving their child
- Opportunities to influence policy or support academic improvement via advisory groups

Recommended steps for parents

- 1 Join advisory council or PTO to stay involved
- 2 Meet with your child's teacher early in the year
- 3 Volunteer in reading events or arts activities
- 4 Review the parent handbook to learn about communication and identity protocols
