Community Report on Earlington Heights Elementary School A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

Earlington Heights Elementary serves students from PreK through fifth grade in Miami with about 350 enrolled and a student teacher ratio close to 16 to 1. Academic performance is steady, with approximately 68 percent proficiency in math and 64 percent in reading, and an overall B rating for equity and improvement.

District guidelines require staff to address students by chosen names and pronouns starting in PreK, with no option for parents to opt out. From a traditional or faith based viewpoint, the school earns a **rating of 3.5 out of 10**. Its academics and school support services are dependable, yet district identity policies may raise questions for some families.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

Earlington Heights Elementary provides Gifted and Talented instruction, STEAM exploration, and literacy initiatives. The school offers reading nights, math challenges, and annual science fairs. Classroom enrichment includes visual arts music, and technology projects to reinforce learning.

2. Student Community and Support Services

Approximately sixty percent of students are Hispanic, thirty percent Black, and the remainder from other backgrounds. Roughly fifty eight percent qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. The

school provides ESL services, reading intervention, special education support, and counseling to support student success.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

Campus facilities include a library media center, STEAM lab, arts classrooms, and outdoor play areas with safe pedestrian zones. School routines prioritize arrival and dismissal safety. After-school clubs such as robotics, reading support, and art classes are offered through community partnerships and volunteer support.

4. Values and Policy Environment

Miami Dade policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected. Staff receive inclusive training and are required to honor student pronouns. Inclusive language may appear in counseling, announcements, or classroom activities. Parents may wish to discuss how identity policy is implemented and how they can share their family preferences with faculty.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

No serious safety or misconduct incidents have been reported. A few parents have noted communication delays after minor behavior issues. School leaders have worked to streamline follow-up procedures and improve parent notifications in response.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Families can engage via monthly advisory council meetings, PTA participation, and Parent Academy events on literacy strategies, safety, and online resources. The school provides newsletters, mobile messaging, and teacher contact platforms. Volunteer opportunities include tutoring, events, and classroom support.

7. Parent Concerns and Recommended Actions

Parents with traditional or faith based values may consider:

- How early identity and pronoun requests are introduced in classrooms
- Access to reading and math support for students needing extra assistance
- Timely parent notification about behavioral or academic concerns
- Influence over school culture through advisory or volunteer roles

Suggested steps for parents

Join advisory council or PTA meetings early, meet with your child's teacher, observe literacy programming, and review the school handbook to understand communication and identity protocols.
