



Community Report on Fairlawn Elementary School

A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Fairlawn Elementary serves students from PreK through fifth grade in Westchester Miami. The school hosts approximately 375 students with a student teacher ratio of sixteen to one. Academic outcomes are solid with about 72 percent proficiency in math and 69 percent proficiency in reading. The school typically receives B grade ratings for performance and equity.

District policy requires staff to use and honor student chosen names and pronouns beginning in early grades. Parents are not offered an opt out option. From a traditional or faith based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 3.5 out of 10**. Families may appreciate the academic strength and active parent community while wanting clarity on how identity policies are applied.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

The school offers Gifted and Talented instruction, STEAM exploration, literacy enrichment nights, and after school clubs in science robotics and the arts. Academic performance is consistent and families report strong foundational learning aided by teacher support and tutoring as needed.

2. Student Community and Support Services

Fairlawn Elementary supports a diverse student body made up of about 65 percent Hispanic and 25 percent Black students. Roughly 50 percent qualify for free or reduced price lunch. Programs include ESL classes reading labs special education support school counseling and after school skill building through parent volunteer programs.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus features modern classrooms a media center STEAM lab outdoor learning areas and a performance stage. Teachers manage safe arrival and dismissal procedures. Student success is promoted through art showcases reading and science fairs involving family support.

4. Values and Policy Environment

Miami Dade policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff must support student preferred pronouns and complete LGBTQ inclusive training. While formal curriculum is not provided on this topic at the elementary level inclusive language may appear in announcements or counseling.

Parents may wish to meet staff early in the school year to confirm how identity policies are implemented and how personal family values are respected.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

No serious safety threats or misconduct are publicly reported. Some parents indicate concerns about communication delays after minor behavioral events. School leaders appear to have improved follow-up protocols to ensure families receive timely information.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents can take part in monthly advisory council meetings Parent Academy workshops reading nights and volunteer opportunities. Regular newsletters updates via school app and teacher communication portals help maintain transparency. Many families report satisfaction with teacher responsiveness and school involvement.

7. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families valuing traditional or faith based frameworks may consider:

- How and when identity and pronoun protocols are introduced
- Academic support options for students needing reinforcement
- Speed of parent communication following classroom incidents
- Ways to participate via advisory groups or school volunteering

Recommended parent actions

Attend council or volunteer meetings early

Chat with your child's teacher to outline expectations and values

Volunteer for events to observe school dynamics and culture
Review the parent handbook and ask about dismissal and notification guidelines

Fairlawn Elementary offers consistent academics, creative programming, and strong community engagement in a well maintained learning environment. Its implementation of district identity policies starting in early grades may concern some families.
