A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

Flagami Elementary serves students from PreK through fifth grade in Miami. The school enrolls approximately 410 students and maintains a student-teacher ratio near sixteen to one. Academic performance is moderate, with around sixty percent proficiency in reading and sixty-five percent proficiency in math. The school typically earns a B rating for performance and improvement.

The school follows district policy that requires staff to respect student-chosen names and pronouns from early grades without offering an opt-out option for parents. From a traditional or faith-based viewpoint, the school receives a **rating of 3.5 out of 10**. While academics and enrichment opportunities are solid, the mandatory identity protocols and occasional lapses in communication may raise concerns.

1. Academic Standing and Programs

The school offers Gifted and Talented classes, STEAM exploration, literacy support nights, and after-school enrichment like art and robotics. While proficiency scores are moderate, the school provides intervention for struggling learners and enrichment for higher performers.

2. Student Community and Support Services

The student population is predominantly Hispanic with growing diversity in background. About fifty percent of students qualify for free or reduced-price lunch. The school supports learners through ESL instruction, special education services, counseling, and reading intervention programs.

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

Flagami Elementary features renovated classrooms, a media center, STEAM lab, and outdoor play areas. Safety procedures for arrival and dismissal are widely implemented. The school hosts community events including reading nights and science fairs to engage families in student learning.

4. Values and Policy Environment

Miami-Dade policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are required to support student pronouns and complete inclusive training. Though no formal LGBTQ curriculum exists for elementary grades, inclusive language may surface in counseling or announcements.

Parents may wish to discuss how these policies are applied and whether family beliefs are respected in day-to-day practices.

5. Recent Incidents or Concerns

No major safety issues or misconduct have been publicly documented. However, some parents report occasional delays in feedback from teachers regarding classroom behavior or homework. Leadership has worked to improve follow-up procedures and communication protocols with families.

6. Parent Engagement and Communication

Families can engage through monthly advisory council and PTA meetings, Parent Academy workshops, classroom volunteering, and school events. The school offers newsletters and messaging updates to help families stay informed about school news and traffic or safety changes. Parent participation in reading nights and STEM showcases is encouraged.

7. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families adhering to traditional values may want to consider:

- How identity and pronoun protocols are incorporated in early grades
- Academic support for reading and math below proficiency
- Timeliness of communication after behavior or classroom concerns
- Opportunities to participate in school governance and advisory meetings

Attend early year advisory or PTA meetings

Meet teachers to set expectations and discuss values Volunteer in enrichment or reading programs to observe classroom culture Review the student parent handbook for clarity on procedures
