A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

Miami Heights Elementary School serves PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami. The school enrolls approximately 400 students with a student teacher ratio of about fifteen to one. Academic performance is moderate with around 59 percent proficiency in math and 55 percent in reading. From a traditional or faith based perspective the school receives a rating of 4 out of 10, reflecting stable academics and a supportive environment, balanced by district identity policies that may not align with all families.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student population is approximately 95 percent Hispanic and 5 percent from other backgrounds
- About 85 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch
 Support services include English language learning programs, special education, Title I funded tutoring in reading and math, and social-emotional support through counseling and coaching

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency averages 59 percent and reading is around 55 percent
- The school offers dual language programming, after school tutoring, and enrichment activities such as science fairs and literacy nights
- Instruction is supported by data driven teaching and instructional coaches

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes standard classrooms, a media center, outdoor play areas, and designated

spaces for intervention programs. Safety procedures are followed for arrival and dismissal. The school hosts family engagement events to support academics

4. Values and Policy Environment

The district includes gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are expected to use student selected names and pronouns beginning in PreK with no parent opt out option. While there is no formal LGBTQ curriculum in early grades, inclusive terms may be used during guidance sessions or announcements. Parents with traditional values may want to clarify how these policies are applied at the classroom level

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are gender segregated with separate facilities for boys and girls. Hallways and shared spaces are monitored by staff. No shared or gender neutral bathrooms are in use. Parents can request a campus tour if needed

6. Recent Issues of Note

There are no recent publicized incidents of safety or misconduct. Attendance is stable, with no confirmed chronic absenteeism figures above typical thresholds

7. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents are encouraged to join the PTA, attend family nights, participate in workshops, and volunteer at school events. Communication occurs through newsletters, parent portals, and bilingual updates. Most families report positive interaction with staff and feel welcomed

8. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or faith based values may wish to consider:

- How gender identity policies are explained to younger students
- Support structures for students who need academic help
- Methods used to inform parents about behavior or performance issues
- Ways to be involved in school events and decision making

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Tour the school and meet staff before enrollment
- Attend school events to observe the environment and culture
- Ask for the parent handbook detailing discipline, identity, and academic policies
- Stay updated on your child's performance and maintain regular teacher communication

Miami Heights Elementary offers stable academics, enrichment opportunities, and a family friendly atmosphere. While district identity policies are applied from early grades, the school maintains gender specific bathrooms and does not implement a formal identity curriculum for younger students. Parents seeking a traditional environment should meet with staff to confirm how classroom practices align with their values.
