



Community Report on Miami Shores Elementary School

A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Miami Shores Elementary School serves PreK through Fifth Grade in the Miami Shores area. It enrolls approximately 350 students with a student teacher ratio of about fourteen to one. Academic performance is moderate with approximately 58 percent proficiency in math and 56 percent proficiency in reading. From a traditional or faith based perspective the school receives a rating of 4 out of 10, reflecting consistent academic programs and a small school setting, while district identity policies may raise concerns for some families.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student body is approximately 85 percent Hispanic, 10 percent African American, and 5 percent from other backgrounds

- About 80 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch

Support services include English language learner instruction, small group tutoring, special education, behavior support services, and counseling supported by Title I funding

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency is around 58 percent and reading proficiency near 56 percent

- The school provides after school tutoring, enrichment clubs, and STEM activities

- Instructional support includes data driven teaching and coaching to support learning gains

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The school campus includes traditional classrooms, a media center, secure play areas, and

multipurpose spaces. Staff supervise arrival and dismissal. Events such as reading nights and academic fairs encourage community and parent involvement

4. Values and Policy Environment

District policy recognizes gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Teachers are required to use student chosen names and pronouns beginning in PreK with no parent opt out. No LGBTQ curriculum is formally in place for early grades, though inclusive terms may be used during general discussions or counseling. Families with traditional views may wish to clarify how these practices are implemented in everyday instruction

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are separated by gender, with boys' and girls' facilities located in secure areas. Staff are present in hallways and shared spaces. No multi use or gender neutral restrooms are part of the standard setup. Parents can request a tour to verify restroom arrangements

6. Recent Issues of Note

There are no recent public reports of misconduct or safety incidents. Attendance trends appear consistent, and no significant chronic absenteeism figures are documented

7. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents can participate in family nights, school improvement teams, and volunteer opportunities. Communication takes place through bilingual newsletters, school messaging systems, and parent meetings. The school encourages strong relationships between families and staff

8. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or faith based values may wish to consider:

- How gender identity and pronoun usage are introduced to younger students
- Intervention options for students needing academic support
- School procedures for notifying parents about behavioral or academic concerns
- Ways to get involved in classroom or advisory roles

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Schedule a school tour and meet with administrators early
- Attend academic and cultural events to learn about the environment
- Request access to the school handbook for behavior and policy information
- Stay engaged with your child's academic progress and connect regularly with teachers
