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## Community Report on North Beach Elementary School

### A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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North Beach Elementary School serves PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami Beach. The school enrolls approximately 930 students with a student-teacher ratio of about eighteen to one. Academic performance is strong with roughly 77 percent proficiency in both math and reading. From a traditional or faith based perspective the school receives a **rating of 5 out of 10**, reflecting high academic results contrasted with recent facility concerns and district identity policies that may not align with all families.

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1. Student Demographics and Support Services
  - Enrollment is about 928 students
  - Support includes Gifted and Talented programming, dual language instruction, special education, reading and math tutoring, counseling, and Title I funded academic support
2. Academic Standing and Programs
  - Proficiency in both math and reading is approximately 77 percent
  - The school offers the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program, STEM enrichment, after school tutoring, and literacy/family engagement events to support learning
3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes modern classrooms, dedicated IB spaces, a media center, and supervised outdoor areas. Safety protocols are observed during arrival and dismissal.

Recently, parents raised facility concerns related to cleanliness and safety conditions that were described as unsanitary or hazardous

4. Values and Policy Environment

District policy classifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are required to honor student chosen names and pronouns beginning in pre-kindergarten without opt out ability. While no formal LGBTQ curriculum is delivered in lower grades, inclusive language may be used during counseling or general communication. Parents may wish to clarify how these policies are implemented at the classroom level

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are gender segregated with separate facilities for boys and girls. Hallways and shared areas are monitored by staff. No shared or co-ed restrooms are in use. Parents may tour the hallways if they wish to confirm current restroom arrangements

6. Recent Issues of Note

Parents voiced concerns in late 2022 over unsanitary and unsafe conditions within the school facilities. These reports highlighted dangerous maintenance issues which the district addressed. Attendance data including chronic absenteeism was not specified in available reporting

7. Religious Practices

No information suggests the school opposes religious practice. Students are allowed personal religious expression during non-instructional times. There is no evidence of anti-religious policies or ideology at the school

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents may participate in advisory council sessions, school improvement events, literacy nights, and volunteer opportunities. Communication is provided through newsletters, multilingual messages, and teacher-family outreach. Families generally report supportive staff, though a few mention variability in administrative responsiveness

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families holding traditional or faith based values may wish to consider:

- How pronoun and gender identity policies are introduced at early grade levels
- Condition of facilities and how safety issues are addressed
- Academic and support programs for students who may need intervention
- Notification protocols following any safety or behavioral incidents

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Schedule a visit to observe classroom and facility conditions
- Request to meet with school leaders to understand policy practices and emergency response

- Obtain the parent handbook for details on identity, attendance, and discipline policies
  - Monitor academic progress and facility updates throughout the year

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#### **Final Summary for Parents**

North Beach Elementary is a high-performing school academically with strong enrichment offerings and school culture. However parents expressed concerns about facility conditions, prompting district intervention. Gender identity policies are applied from early grades, and restrooms remain gender-segregated. Religious expression is permitted informally. Families seeking excellent academic programming within a values-aligned and safe environment are encouraged to visit the campus, review policies with leadership, and stay actively informed about facility and academic conditions.
