Palm Springs North Elementary School serves students from PreK through Fifth Grade in Hialeah. The school enrolls approximately 800 students and maintains a student teacher ratio close to sixteen to one. Academic performance is notably strong with around 77 percent proficiency in math and 73 percent in reading. From a traditional or faith based perspective the school receives a rating of 7.5 out of 10, reflecting strong academics and a structured environment with minimal policy-related concerns.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student population is predominantly Hispanic with a small representation of White and African American students
- Approximately 56 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch
 The school provides support through gifted education programs, special education, English language learning services, counseling, and academic tutoring funded in part through Title I

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency is about 77 percent and reading proficiency stands at approximately 73 percent
- The school offers gifted and advanced coursework, STEM based projects, and literacy focused events
- Teachers use data driven instruction and individualized support to help students meet goals

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The school features well maintained classrooms, a library media center, a science lab, and outdoor areas for play and learning. Security measures include supervised entry and dismissal routines. Cleanliness and order are emphasized

4. Values and Policy Environment

In line with district standards, the school follows policies that recognize gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Teachers are required to use student selected names and pronouns beginning in PreK without an opt out provision for parents. While no LGBTQ curriculum is officially introduced in early grades, inclusive language may appear in guidance lessons or schoolwide messages

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

The school uses traditional gender separated restrooms for boys and girls. These are monitored by staff to maintain safety and privacy. There are no multi use or gender neutral bathrooms in the main student areas

6. Recent Issues of Note

No major safety issues or disciplinary incidents have been recently reported. Chronic absenteeism is not a major concern at this time. School operations appear well structured and consistent

7. Religious Practices

There have been no reports of anti religious sentiment or restrictions. Students are allowed to pray or engage in quiet religious activities during non instructional periods. The school does not interfere with religious expression when done privately and respectfully

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

The school maintains a high level of parent engagement through regular communication via newsletters and digital portals. Parents can participate in the PTA, volunteer activities, academic nights, and family outreach events. Staff are generally responsive to family concerns

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional values may wish to consider:

- The implementation of identity related policies in lower grades
- The scope of student support services and how they align with family needs
- Engagement opportunities that allow parents to observe classroom culture

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Schedule a school tour and meet with the principal
- Request access to the school's family handbook and review policies
- Attend parent nights and volunteer when possible
- Monitor student progress using parent portals and teacher feedback

Palm Springs North Elementary School offers a well performing academic environment with strong community engagement and structured programs. District identity policies apply beginning in PreK but are not widely reported as disruptive. The school respects personal religious expression and supports student progress across a range of learning needs.
