



Community Report on Riverside Elementary School

A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Riverside Elementary School serves students from PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami, Florida. The school has an enrollment of approximately 490 students with a student teacher ratio of about fifteen to one. Academic proficiency is developing, with around 43 percent of students proficient in math and 40 percent in reading. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 5 out of 10**, reflecting a structured learning environment and bilingual programming, alongside district identity policies that may not align with all family values.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student body is approximately 96 percent Hispanic, 3 percent African American, and 1 percent other groups

- Over 95 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch

Support services include bilingual education, Title I funded tutoring, exceptional student education (ESE), counseling, and reading recovery interventions

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency is approximately 43 percent and reading proficiency around 40 percent
- Bilingual instruction and English Language Learner support are core parts of the curriculum
- Intervention blocks, i-Ready diagnostics, and after-school tutoring are used to improve student achievement

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus features basic classroom spaces, a library, outdoor activity areas, and visual reminders of behavior expectations. Safety procedures are in place for arrival and dismissal, and teachers emphasize structure and respect in the learning environment

4. Values and Policy Environment

The district enforces policies that recognize gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff must use student-chosen names and pronouns beginning in PreK, without a parent opt-out. Although there is no formal LGBTQ curriculum at this level, inclusive terms may be used in classroom dialogue or guidance activities. Parents with traditional values are advised to meet with school staff to clarify how these policies are applied day-to-day

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are separated by gender, with distinct boys' and girls' facilities. No gender-neutral or shared restrooms are publicly indicated for students. Staff supervise transitions during school hours and maintain safety throughout the day

6. Recent Issues of Note

No major incidents of misconduct, violence, or safety concerns have been publicly reported. Chronic absenteeism data is not available for this school. Reviews highlight a friendly and dedicated staff, though academic achievement remains a challenge district-wide

7. Religious Practices

There are no reports of religious opposition or conflict. Students may pray or reflect silently during non-instructional time. Religious attire is allowed, and no incidents of anti-religious ideology or restriction have been documented

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parent involvement is encouraged through school events, workshops, conferences, and newsletters provided in English and Spanish. While communication is generally consistent, some parents report delays in academic updates or difficulty reaching staff

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or faith-based perspectives may wish to consider:

- Whether staff implementation of identity policies aligns with family beliefs
- Available support for students falling behind in core subjects
- How religious practices are respected on campus
- Consistency and responsiveness of school communication

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Request a school tour and speak with the principal about values and policies
- Attend family events to observe the school's approach to community and instruction
- Review the school handbook and ask specific questions about identity and discipline practices
- Monitor your child's academic data and engage with teachers consistently
