Rockway Elementary School serves students from PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami, Florida. The school enrolls approximately 500 students with a student teacher ratio of about fifteen to one. Academic performance is above average, with about 66 percent proficiency in math and 62 percent in reading. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 6.5 out of 10**, supported by strong academics and clear communication, though district identity policies may not align with all family values.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student population is approximately 93 percent Hispanic, 5 percent White, and 2 percent other racial groups
- Around 74 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch
 Support services include gifted programs, English language learner support, special education, reading intervention, and after-school tutoring

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency stands at approximately 66 percent and reading at 62 percent
- The school provides STEM enrichment, computer lab access, art and music programs, and academic competitions
- Title I funding supports supplemental instruction in core subjects

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes updated classrooms, a media center, outdoor playgrounds, and science

labs. Safety is reinforced through staff supervision, visitor protocols, and structured arrival and dismissal. School events foster student engagement and family involvement

4. Values and Policy Environment

The school adheres to district guidelines protecting gender identity and sexual orientation. Staff are required to use students' chosen names and pronouns starting in PreK. Parents cannot opt out of these identity-related policies. While no formal LGBTQ curriculum is used in early grades, inclusive language may appear in counseling or classroom discussions. Families who hold traditional values are advised to review these policies with school leaders

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Student restrooms are designated by gender with separate facilities for boys and girls. There are no reported gender-neutral or shared multi-user restrooms. Hallways and restroom areas are supervised for safety. Parents may request a school tour to review facilities

6. Recent Issues of Note

There have been no major publicized incidents of misconduct or safety concerns. Chronic absenteeism is not prominently reported and appears to be within average range. The school continues to focus on academic growth and community building

7. Religious Practices

No conflicts related to religious expression have been reported. Students may pray or observe religious practices during non-instructional times. There is no evidence of staff or administration discouraging religious activity

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents are actively involved through PTA events, parent-teacher conferences, and volunteer opportunities. Communication is consistent via emails, bilingual flyers, school apps, and the parent portal. Staff are generally responsive to inquiries and concerns

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or faith-based views may consider:

- How identity and pronoun use policies are applied in early grades
- The strength of support services for students needing help academically
- Whether religious expression is respected in practice as well as policy
- How the school handles curriculum transparency and parent communication

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Schedule a school tour and speak with the principal about values and policies
- Review the student handbook for identity, discipline, and academic expectations
- Join PTA or attend school events to understand community culture
- Maintain ongoing communication with teachers to track academic and social progress
