



Community Report on Royal Green Elementary School

A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

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Royal Green Elementary School serves students from PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami, Florida. The school enrolls approximately 380 students, maintaining a student teacher ratio of about fourteen to one. Academic performance is steady, with approximately 61 percent proficiency in math and 58 percent in reading. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 6 out of 10**, due to balanced academic achievement, community engagement, and adherence to district identity policies that may raise concerns for some families.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student body is approximately 96 percent Hispanic, 3 percent White, and 1 percent other racial groups

- Over 80 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch

Support services include bilingual education, Title I reading and math interventions, special education, speech therapy, and after-school tutoring

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency averages around 61 percent and reading proficiency near 58 percent

- The school offers computer literacy, visual arts, and literacy intervention programs

- Small group instruction and use of technology support differentiated learning

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The school features updated classrooms, a media center, a computer lab, and secure

playgrounds. Daily operations prioritize safety with staff-supervised arrival and dismissal. Family-oriented events such as reading nights and school spirit days are regularly hosted

4. Values and Policy Environment

Royal Green Elementary follows district protocols protecting gender identity and sexual orientation. Staff must use student-selected names and pronouns beginning in PreK, with no option for parents to opt out. While no structured LGBTQ curriculum is in place for early grades, inclusive language may occur during general activities or guidance lessons. Parents with traditional beliefs should inquire directly with school staff for clarity

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are gender-specific and separated for boys and girls. There are no shared or unisex restrooms reported. Supervision in hallways and common areas helps ensure student safety. Parents may confirm arrangements through a school tour

6. Recent Issues of Note

There are no public records of major safety concerns or incidents at the school. Chronic absenteeism is not prominently documented and appears to be within average district levels. School staff continue to promote attendance and student engagement

7. Religious Practices

There are no reported restrictions on personal religious expression. Students may pray or observe religious practices during non-instructional periods. No evidence suggests the school discourages religious beliefs or participation

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parent involvement is encouraged through school advisory meetings, volunteer opportunities, and literacy events. Communication is offered in English and Spanish through newsletters, phone blasts, and digital platforms. Most parent feedback reflects positive experiences with responsiveness and transparency

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or religious perspectives may want to explore:

- How gender identity policies are communicated and enforced in primary grades
- The effectiveness of academic supports and tutoring availability
- How religious expression is accommodated and whether policies are consistently applied
- Communication channels used by the school and responsiveness to parent concerns

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Arrange a school visit and ask about instructional approaches and student support
- Request and review the parent handbook to understand policies and expectations
- Stay informed about student progress and communicate with teachers regularly
- Join family events and advisory councils to stay connected with the school culture

Royal Green Elementary offers a supportive academic setting with targeted interventions and a caring staff. The school aligns with Miami Dade's district-wide identity policies, which may not reflect the preferences of all families. Restroom and privacy protocols are conventional, and religious expression is respected. Parents are encouraged to meet with school personnel, review policy documents, and engage early to ensure alignment with family expectations.
