Santa Clara Elementary School serves PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami, Florida. It enrolls approximately 250 students, with a student-teacher ratio of about twelve to one. Academic performance is moderate, with math proficiency around 42 percent and reading proficiency close to 47 percent. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 4.5 out of 10**, reflecting its intimate learning environment and community ties, while noting the potential for concerns regarding district-wide identity policies.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student population is approximately 75 percent Hispanic, 21 percent African American, and 4 percent other racial groups
- Over 95 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch Support services include English language learning, speech therapy, special education, and Title Lacademic interventions

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency is around 42 percent, and reading proficiency is approximately 47 percent
- The school offers reading and math intervention, enrichment activities, and after-school academic support
- Staff use small group instruction and targeted resources to address student learning gaps

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes traditional classrooms, a computer lab, and secured outdoor spaces.

Safety measures are in place during arrival, dismissal, and recess. School spirit is fostered through family nights, academic events, and classroom celebrations

4. Values and Policy Environment

Santa Clara follows Miami Dade County district policies that recognize gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are directed to use student-selected names and pronouns from PreK onward. There is no specific LGBTQ curriculum in early grades, though inclusive references may appear during counseling or general discussions. Families with traditional values may choose to speak with school leaders for clarification

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are gender-specific and supervised. There are no known shared or unisex restrooms. Parents concerned about privacy can contact the school to confirm current arrangements

6. Recent Issues of Note

No major safety or misconduct issues have been publicly reported. Attendance trends appear typical for the school's setting. Staff are focused on increasing student engagement and addressing learning recovery

7. Religious Practices

No documented conflicts regarding religious expression have been reported. Students are allowed to pray or engage in personal religious practices during non-instructional time. There is no indication of school opposition to religion

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Santa Clara supports parent involvement through workshops, open house events, volunteer opportunities, and bilingual communication. While the school's smaller size limits some offerings, staff are generally accessible and supportive

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Parents with traditional or faith-based views may consider:

- Asking how identity policies are applied at the PreK and primary levels
- Reviewing how academic gaps are addressed through Title I and classroom support
- Ensuring the school permits religious expression in line with personal beliefs
- Staying in close communication with staff and monitoring academic progress
