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## **A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment**

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**Seminole Elementary School** serves PreK through Fifth Grade students in Miami, Florida. It enrolls approximately 620 students with a student-teacher ratio of about fifteen to one. Academic performance is strong, with around 65 percent proficiency in math and 58 percent proficiency in reading. From a traditional or faith-based perspective, the school receives a **rating of 6.5 out of 10**, reflecting solid academic outcomes, consistent family engagement, and a neutral approach to controversial identity policies.

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### **1. Student Demographics and Support Services**

- The student body is approximately 95 percent Hispanic, with small percentages of White and multiracial students
  - Around 87 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch
- Support services include bilingual education, special education, mental health counseling, speech therapy, and Title I academic intervention

### **2. Academic Standing and Programs**

- Math proficiency averages around 65 percent and reading proficiency 58 percent
- The school offers gifted programs, STEM activities, English language learner support, and after-school tutoring
- Teaching is data-driven, with targeted small group instruction and literacy intervention

### **3. Facilities and Learning Environment**

The campus includes modern classrooms, a renovated media center, computer labs, and

outdoor play areas. Staff maintain visible supervision throughout the day, and arrival and dismissal are organized for safety and order

#### **4. Values and Policy Environment**

Miami-Dade County district policies require staff to affirm gender identity and pronoun preferences starting in PreK. There is no structured LGBTQ curriculum in early grades, but inclusive references may occur through counseling or events. The school has not promoted or publicized any such content in early instruction. Parents with traditional values may wish to ask how these policies are implemented at the local level

#### **5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy**

Restrooms are gender-specific, with separate facilities for boys and girls. No multi-user, mixed-gender bathrooms have been reported. Staff monitor common areas, and no concerns around bathroom privacy have been noted

#### **6. Recent Issues of Note**

No major safety or discipline incidents have been publicly reported. Attendance levels are stable, with no signs of extreme chronic absenteeism. The school has been recognized for consistent academic growth and student performance

#### **7. Religious Practices**

There are no reported incidents of the school restricting religious practices. Students are allowed to engage in individual religious expression during non-instructional time. The school environment appears respectful of religious diversity

#### **8. Parent Engagement and Communication**

The school hosts family literacy events, parent workshops, and advisory council meetings. Communication is provided in English and Spanish through newsletters, phone calls, and digital platforms. Parent feedback suggests that teachers and staff are responsive and cooperative

#### **9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions**

Families with faith-based or traditional expectations may wish to:

- Confirm how identity and pronoun policies are applied in classroom practice
- Track progress in reading and math and explore academic support if needed
- Stay engaged through family nights and school events
- Build relationships with staff early in the year

#### **Recommended next steps for parents:**

- Schedule a school visit and request a parent handbook
- Meet with teachers or administrators to ask questions about policy application
- Sign up for family workshops to stay informed and connected
- Review academic reports and follow up if intervention is needed
