A Traditional Parent's Perspective on School Policies and Environment

South Pointe Elementary School serves PreK through Fifth Grade in Miami Beach. It enrolls approximately 460 students with a student teacher ratio of about fifteen to one. Academic performance is strong with roughly 67 percent proficiency in math and 63 percent proficiency in reading. Chronic absenteeism has recently increased to around 31 percent. From a traditional or faith based perspective the school receives a rating of 3.5 out of 10, reflecting high academic achievement balanced by attendance challenges and district identity policies that may not align with all families.

1. Student Demographics and Support Services

- The student body is approximately 58 percent Hispanic, 36 percent White, 4 percent multiracial, and 2 percent African American
- Around 42 percent of students qualify for free or reduced price lunch
 Support services include gifted education dual language programs special education reading and math tutoring counseling and instructional coaching supported by Title I funding

2. Academic Standing and Programs

- Math proficiency averages around 67 percent and reading proficiency near 63 percent
- The school offers the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program STEM activities literacy nights and after school academic support
- Instructional coaching and differentiated instruction help support student progress

3. Facilities and Learning Environment

The campus includes modern classrooms a media center outdoor learning areas and IB focused spaces. Supervised arrival and dismissal ensure safety. Events such as reading nights math fairs and parent workshops promote family involvement and engagement

4. Values and Policy Environment

District policy identifies gender identity and sexual orientation as protected categories. Staff are required to use student chosen names and pronouns beginning in PreK with no opt out available for parents. While there is no formal LGBTQ curriculum in early grades inclusive language may appear during counseling or announcements. Parents who prefer a traditional learning environment may wish to clarify how these policies are applied in practice

5. Bathroom Policy and Privacy

Restrooms are separated by gender with distinct facilities for boys and girls. Hallways and common areas are supervised by staff. There are no shared or multi use restrooms. Parents can request a school tour for confirmation if needed

6. Recent Issues of Note

Chronic absenteeism has increased significantly in recent years reaching approximately 31 percent. The school has initiated outreach efforts attendance incentives and family engagement strategies to address the issue. No major safety or misconduct incidents have been publicly reported

7. Religious Practices

There are no documented conflicts with religious practices. Students may engage in personal religious expression during non instructional time. No indication of school opposition to religion has been reported

8. Parent Engagement and Communication

Parents can take part in the advisory council family workshops volunteer activities and literacy nights. Communication is provided through newsletters bilingual messages and parent portals. Most parents report positive interactions with staff though some experience delays in response

9. Parent Concerns and Suggested Actions

Families with traditional or faith based values may wish to consider:

- How gender identity and pronoun policies are introduced in early grades
- Academic support options for students falling behind
- Notification methods used for attendance or behavior issues
- Opportunities to engage with school leadership and volunteer

Recommended next steps for parents:

- Tour the school and meet with staff early in the year
- Attend academic and enrichment events to observe the school culture

- Request a copy of the parent handbook for discipline attendance and identity policies
- Track academic and attendance data and seek help if needed

Final Summary for Parents

South Pointe Elementary provides high academic performance a strong International Baccalaureate program and multiple opportunities for parent engagement. However the rise in absenteeism and district wide identity policies may concern families with traditional values. Restroom facilities follow a standard gender separation model. Religious practices are permitted during free time. Parents are encouraged to tour the school meet with staff and clarify how school practices align with their family expectations.
